THE RESIDENCY PROGRAMME

We invite applications for a three-year residency programme in Veterinary Anaesthesia and Analgesia, which will start on 01/10/2025. The residency is designed to prepare candidates for the ECVAA Diploma. Throughout the programme, residents will gain extensive experience in clinical anaesthesia and engage in clinical research. You will have the privilege of learning under the supervision of 2 ECVAA and 1 ACVAA diplomate. Your responsibilities will include actively participating in the management of patients admitted for anaesthesia for various surgical and diagnostic procedures. Additionally, you will be involved in a one-in-four on-call rotation and will contribute to the teaching commitment of the anaesthesia team.

ELIGIBILITY AND REQUIREMENTS

The candidate should hold a DVM or equivalent degree from an accredited veterinary school allowing him/her to practice veterinary medicine in Belgium. The successful candidate has finished a one-year rotating internship in companion animals that needs to be approved by the ECVAA education committee and has ideally experience in veterinary anaesthesia. Proficiency in the French language is an advantage. Effective communication and interpersonal skills are essential attributes, as the role requires collaboration within a team-oriented environment.
