THE TRAINING COURSE

This residency provides a unique opportunity to improve your knowledge and skills in Companion Animal Diagnostic Imaging starting September 1, 2026. You will learn under the close supervision of 7 ECVDI diplomates (SA and/or LA) and 1 senior clinician. You will participate in the management of patients admitted to diagnostic imaging during the daytime schedule, in emergencies and on-call, including some large animals cases. You will be actively involved in the supervision of students.



THE CLINIC

The Veterinary University Clinic (CVU) at the University of Liège is a renowned institution for veterinary care, education, and research. With specialists from various disciplines, we offer advanced diagnostic and therapeutic services for animals and provide a training ground for future veterinarians and specialists.



SKILLS

The candidate should be a team player, eager to grow and a critical thinker, and have a collaborative and knowledge-sharing mindset. She/he should hold a diploma in veterinary medicine recognized within the European Union or deemed equivalent with the right to be registered or to be eligible for registration with the Belgian Veterinary Order. He/she should have completed a rotating companion animal internship or have an equivalent clinical experience. He/she should have a good knowledge of the French language, or a strong willingness to learn quickly to reach an operational level, to efficiently communicate with students and colleagues.

Your application should include a curriculum vitae, a cover letter, and 2 letters of reference. All applicants are encouraged to schedule a visit of the clinic.
